Thank you for your donation, especially as it came at this time of year when donations are down, but expenses keep flowing!

I've spent the last two months in anxiety over our financial situation, but, thank God and the Virgin Mary, we always seem to pull through. But I also think of those elderly here and those parents who are also struggling in these economic times to feed their kids. We help them when we can. Today I got a call from a man with a big family who said he'd been robbed of his pay by his boss who left for Japan. I'm not sure yet what we can do for him. I paid one month's rent for his apartment. Hopefully that will give him more time to get things straightened out. We will be remembering you and your intentions in prayers every day as part of our "thank you". I'm thinking how great God is, giving me a vow of poverty and giving you a chance to be generous! Amazing, isn't it? God bless you!

By the way, on the envelope you will see the "25 Years" mark. On August 25, 1991, before the end of the Soviet Union, our "future parishioners" had their first meeting to plan to open the parish again. So one can say it is also 25 years of religious freedom in Russia. The parishioners had to form the parish corporation in order to invite any foreign priests, and, of course, there were no priests to be had in Russia itself! We came in
