The hospice at Dalzavod Hospital in Vladivostok is now open again after capital repairs on the building. Our volunteers have been going there to help with the patients for many years already. The poorest of the poor die there. We've also given equipment when we could, like water heaters--They didn't used to have hot water for even washing dishes all summer—electric beds, a shower, and for the patients, bread and foodstuffs regularly. During the economic crisis in the '90's it was absolutely necessary aid. Today they have new equipment, and our work is mostly visiting the patients and helping them to eat at mealtime, plus some recreation when the Sisters come to sing and play the harp for them. They love it!
