Dear Benefactor,

January 31, 2021

I hope and pray you are doing fine! Maybe you have been following our escapades for some time and you know that we were directly hit by a **supertyphoon** on September 3, and the result is a lot of damage to the roof of the rectory. Then on November 19 we were hit by an **ice storm** that left 1½ inches of ice on everything, breaking down trees all over the city. The result for us was that the ice on the rectory roof sealed the shingles that were broken by the supertyphoon, so we've had little leakage of water through the ice this winter. But as spring comes we'll have to **re-shingle the whole roof**. It would have been nice to just replace broken or torn shingles, but the present roof was done years ago with Soviet shingles which are no longer available and of a different size than any replacements that we can buy now. So we are looking for help with this project. Andre, our building superintendent, says it will cost \$14,450! If you would like to help us with this, putting "**roof**" on the memo of your check or bank payment should do the job! Thank you, if you can help! Where would we be without our benefactors?!

We've had major **snowstorms** this year with raging winds—very unusual. For a couple of years we hardly had any snow at all. The storms paralyze the city for some time, as we really aren't over the ice storm that we had earlier—thick ice lies everywhere! We've had the "**Baptism Freeze**", which is what the Russians call the bad weather about the time of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, and now they are looking forward to the "**Chinese Freeze**", which means the last blast of Arctic weather about the time of Chinese New Year. It will signal the arrival of spring soon after--hopefully! Yeah, Sun!!

Soon I'll have been a priest for 50 years, but something happened on Sunday, January 24th that was a first for me. We had a **double wedding ceremony** for two Vietnamese couples of our parish! They didn't speak English or Russian, and I don't speak Vietnamese, so I had to do the wedding through an interpreter. The music in Vietnamese was wonderful, the flowers were fantastic, and the people were so happy for the couples. Many of the attendees were Buddhists, which was a first for us, too. Of course people

were in masks, kept distances, and got their hands sprayed at the door.
