It is a Toyota Passo made in Japan, so the steering wheel is on the wrong side, but we are used to that here— Almost all the cars here are Japanese! We sure need good cars, as we are now taking care of all seven Catholic parishes in this state the size of Wisconsin, and also several parishes in Kazakhstan. Thanks for your prayers for us, too!
