### To Russia With Fear

When it comes to discernment, there needs to be action. Little did I know or expect how God would use my "Yes" to His call. He answered through financial provision. He directed my steps through prayer. He exceeded all my expectation because His plan is more extraordinary than anything I could have planned for myself. I feel speechless when trying to describe my experience in Russia. During the final week, while in Khabarovsk, I began to pray for words. These words barely touch the tip of the iceberg, although, it's a start.



What? Afraid of them? Ever hear of the Little Rascals?

### **IMMERSIVE**

Attending daily mass, a scheduled holy hour, morning and evening prayer; before this mission trip my prayer life did not include consistency. God needs consistency, though, to be able to reveal himself. In every form of prayer, God moved in my life revealing wounds that needed healing, revealing situations that needed to be released, revealing new potentials for the future. I learned – and still am learning – to be fully open to the movements of grace, mercy and love that God wanted to show me. I need to be willing to receive. It all begins with

prayer. I have begun to understand and encounter Him more deeply through the mass as it is the source and summit of our life; it is our foundational prayer.

#### **HUMBLING**

As a student studying Speech Language Pathology, I am aware that only 7% of communication is based on physical language. However, stepping into an environment where we are stripped of physical language, communication presented itself as a challenge. Yes, there were multiple translators which were invaluable to the experience. To build personal connections, I began to view myself through the lens of a potential client – one who cannot communicate through language; this is how they would feel. Communication through actions and body language became a primary source of interacting with the children. It required patience – a lot of patience. Love, though, knows no boundaries. We loved these children by fully being present in the moment, making arts and crafts with them and for them, engaging in sports, giving hugs, high fives and piggy-back rides. It's not about knowing the language, it's about being present and allowing the Holy Spirit to move.

#### INTENSE

The willingness of people to share their stories as well as the history of Russia – especially that of the Far East – shatters my heart. For all that they have endured, many people feel hopeless. Their hope has been stripped away due to the suppression, repression, and oppression under communism. Many individuals who had a strong faith were imprisoned and martyred. Yet to see thirty years later, the youth of Russia, they are hungry for spiritual food. They desire to grow in their faith – through prayer, through the sacraments, through vulnerability. Amid hopelessness, there can be joy!

There is no way that I could have endured this trip alone. The team – including the CJD Sisters, brothers, and Father Myron – have become family. Each and every one of us have an entire team of people who have been praying for us and this trip, for which we are beyond grateful. Thank you for being a part of my journey. ## We are Different but One in Faith—FOCUS in Indonesia, 2018

The Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS) from the United States came for the fourth time to be with the young people in Indonesia. The total number of the Focus team this year was 20--14 women and 6 men. This is greater than the number of Focus members that came in previous years. Not only is the number of members increasing, but the agenda of Focus team activities this year was also slightly different from previous years. This year the Focus group worked with the Augustinian Canons C.J.D. We had programs with the students in four schools and also with the young people in the Holy Spirit Parish of Nelle.

On July 16-19, 2018 the Focus team visited St. Gabriel Senior High School. For three days the Focus team shared their faith and love for Jesus with teachers and students. In this time they also had "Lectio Divina"--sharing the Scriptures and sharing about the dangers of drugs, free sex and alcohol. The entire three day event was closed with mass, a meal, photos, and a native dance together. On July 19-21, 2018 Focus visited St. Mathilda Catholic Senior High School. The programs in this school were the same as in the previous school.

On July 22, 2018 early in the morning, the team, together with priests and and our brothers went to visit the parish of the Holy Spirit in Nelle. For two nights and three days, the Focus team was with the parishioners. The Focus team, priests, and brothers C.J.D. divided into

parishioners' homes. While in Nelle, the Focus team also visited several schools, Bethlehem Prayer Park, and also met and shared their faith experiences with the children and young Catholics of Nelle parish. The entire activities at Nelle parish were closed with mass and recreation together at Koka beach. The Focus team really enjoyed the beauty of Koka beach with sea water so clean, so no wonder when we arrived at Koka beach they immediately went for swimming. They not only enjoyed the beauty of Koka beach, but we all really enjoyed the beauty of our lives as brothers and sisters in faith. That is the beauty that we have and too bad it isn't shared with all others. On Wednesday, July 25, 2018 FOCUS went back to America via Bali.

Through this faith experience, the focus team has taught us how we have to live our faith amid the increasingly uncertain globalization and how we must build an intimate relationship with Jesus Christ. The experience of meeting with the Focus team gives us a special color in living our faith in Jesus Christ. Although the time was very short, the experience of faith they have shared will always be remembered in every step of our lives. Thank you for the experience of faith that you have shared with us. We will always remember it and try to live it in our daily lives. Thank you for the togetherness and the sense of brotherhood that we cultivated for a few days in our community. Distance may be able to separate us but in faith we are always united. We pray that the Focus team will be growing in quality and quantity from day to day. We pray for each other and hopefully at another time God will bring us together again.

Recently when I had to fly to Kazakhstan for Brother Patrick's ordination I was pleased to see how many whole families were travelling, and how many children were on the planes and in the airports. What a different from just a few years ago! Even so, the Women's Centers are struggling with funding difficulties.

• Brother **Hubertus Jacobus**, C.J.D. was ordained a deacon on June 10 in Maumere, Indonesia. He is an accomplished musician whose composition and solo



performance of a great song about Vladivostok won a prize in a contest at the intervarsity talent show a couple of years ago here in the city. We are hoping he will be able to return to Vladivostok after ordination to the priesthood. Besides playing the organ and keyboard he is an accomplished composer of religious music, too.

• On June 23 our longtime former parishioner and my former secretary **Evgeny Balanyov** was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Minsk-Mogilev, Belarus. He began in the seminary as our parishioner, but took some time out to do business in St Petersburg. Now we are waiting to see what his assignment will be in Belorus. He has always been entrepreneurial—When he was young he organized and ran a wholesale ice cream concession when this was still the Soviet Union! He gave lots of work to elderly folks during the bad economic days of the '90's.



• Here is a picture of our **four new novice C.J.D. sisters** in Indonesia, with Fr Inosensius Hetu who was there to bless their clothing. Sister Angel (left from Fr) and Sister Rosa (right from Fr) were present, too. The event took place in Jakarta, but the sister-novices then travelled to the Ende Archdiocese on Flores Island for their novice year. The sisters operate the Holy Angel Orphanage near Jakarta.



- We got a notice from our Bishop Kirill that Brother Nikita Kushnaryov, C.J.D. will be ordained a deacon for us here in Russia on August 19! (And there are still two more seminarians to be ordained deacons this year. I'm waiting for the bishops to assign a date. That will be six deacons this year (seven if we count Balanyov), which means six priests next year! Hallelujah!)
- Thanks be to God, Rev Vicar General of the Diocese of Maumere, Fr Ewaldus Martinus Penu, was chosen by Pope Francis to become the **next Bishop of the Diocese of** Maumere in Indonesia, where your community and seminary is located. He was was born in Bajawa, Flores Island on July 30, 1959. He graduated with a Master's Degree in Education from the Salesianum in Rome. From 2001-2009, he was a formation director in the Major Seminary of St Peter, the place where Pope John Paul II stayed overnight when he visited Maumere in 1989. Then Fr Ewaldus was elected Rector of the Major Seminary of St Peter from 2010-2015, after which he was appointed Vicar General of the Diocese of Maumere by Bishop Kherubim Paraira, SVD, our great friend who invited us to his diocese, and who is now retiring. It was Fr Ewaldus who blessed our temporary seminary building in Maumere in 2015, and who recommended a seminarian to join our community. He told him, "You join CJD, because their mission will help the local bishop." We will of help to the future Bishop Ewaldus! Praise God for He has chosen our new bishop and thanks for our Bishop Kherubim Paraira, SVD who really loved to have our CJD seminary present in his diocese.

- Seminarians Bro Rajnal Rehman, C.J.D. and Bro Pradeep Mulupuri, C.J.D. finished novitiate in Vladivostok and took their first vows in their home countries of Pakistan and India. They will be attending the seminary in their home countries but they will studying in English. The plan was for them to study in the Philippines, but visa problems made that impossible. Guess what! They will probably recruit new members for our order where they are—God always has his plan. We already received three requests from India. We'll see what God wants. Thanks, benefactors for supporting our seminarians!

A pregnant girl came to us for help; she was from an orphanage. Her father was in prison for drug abuse; her mother froze to death while drunk. When she graduated from the orphanage she didn't receive an apartment from the government because none were available. Now, pregnant, she had nowhere to live. Our volunteer brought the girl to her home as a temporary measure while we helped her to appeal to the local legislative deputy for help. When the girl gave birth to a healthy baby girl they gave her a room in a dormitory. Our volunteer continued to mentor her how to be a mother, how to diaper the baby, how to dress and feed her, and took care of the baby when mom needed time for rest or business. Now the "baby" goes to kindergarten and mom goes to work. And our volunteer is like mama and grandma to the little family.

While she was pregnant her grandfather died, so she was able to go to live in his apartment which was in a different village. We went to her home, and gradually she was able to come to us at the Center. Now her son is a year old. She is a very attentive and careful mother. We are so glad that we were able to help her.

### From the Women's Support Centers

A 16 year old girl came to our Center saying she was pregnant. Her parents refused to help her so she turned to her grandma who invited her to live with her. The parents of the young father forbade him to even speak to her, and moved him to a different city. A healthy baby girl was born, but how to feed and care for her when you are only in the 10<sup>th</sup> grade, and grandma's pension is too small even for one person. Feeling that her situation was hopeless, the girl decided on suicide and took an overdose. The doctors arrived in time to save her and she was sent temporarily to the psychiatric unit of the hospital. Meanwhile the Center volunteers were helping her and grandma, as well as the baby. Now mom is back in school in the 10<sup>th</sup> grade, and grandma is caring for the baby, but they continue to need our help.
